

Financial planning is biblical and is a means to good stewardship, to freedom from the god of materialism, and a means of protection against the waste of the resources God has entrusted to our care.







life.**




THE PSYCHOLOGY OF WEALTH

Again, no amount of money will ever make you wealthy. Wealth is primarily a matter of spiritual understanding.




THE SEVEN TYPES OF WEALTH


